Teaching staff at Sithney have undergone climate change training and development to better inform pupils of the science around climate change and have achieved the educate Global Bronze Award. The eduCCate Global Bronze Award is the first bold step in building a coherent whole school approach to climate change that is designed to build schools' confidence and capacity to deliver high impact solution focused climate change education. Schools who undertake the eduCCate Global Awards program are committed to being a leader in their community, and to fueling climate action.

One of the actions involved the planting of 150 trees on the school field and over 50 parents, pupils and staff supported this event. For this and the additional activities by the school community the school has just received the Woodland Trust Bronze award and the Eco-Schools Green Flag award with Merit.
