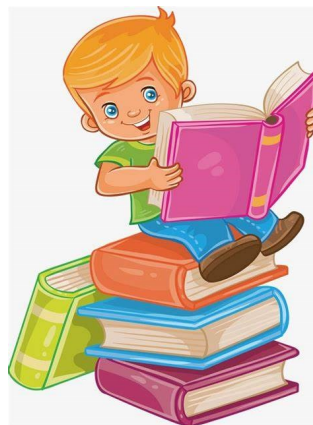

### **COVID**

In light of the current rise of COVID cases in the community, please see the below, which is current advice from the Health Protection Team:

#### **COVID**

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

#### **COUGHS AND COLDS**

It's fine for a child to attend school with a minor cough or common cold. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes.

Encourage children to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

#### **HIGH TEMPERATURE**

If a child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away
