This text is an invented traditional tale linking to the history topic of Ancient Egypt. This fiction story is another tale to continue to support the teaching of the Egyptians as part of the topic for the Autumn Term.	These texts are based on the geography unit Geography unit. The texts help to support the teaching of the different parts of the river and the water cycle until the water finally makes it to the sea. By using both texts, it enables the children to learn about the water cycle and produce an information text relating to it.	This text links with the history topic of The Romans and the significance of Pompeii during the Roman era.	This text focuses on early civilisation and will link with the Geography unit focussing on Europe.	This wordless picture book links with other wordless picture books taught in KS1 and UKS2. This book bases itself on adventure, friendship and the world. Linking to the history topic of Anglo Saxons and Vikings, this text will further explore what life was like in these times.
