Develop the music curriculum to deliver high quality provision.	A two-year rolling programme using Kapow is in place. Staff must follow it. Subject Leader to monitor music termly across the school. First Access sessions are taking place in UKS2 and KS1 during the Autumn term. First Access sessions have been planned into the two-year rolling programme. Musical opportunities planned to enhance the curriculum, providing opportunities to listen to live and pre-recorded live music. This year a ukulele band will be visiting in the Autumn term. Subject Leader to keep updated with ASONE events. Workshop with Will Keating and a chance to perform with him, along with other schools. Opportunities to practise, celebrate, perform and enjoy music — lunchtime music club, after school music club, after school singing club, possibly linking with Porthleven school choir on a Weds after school.
