As a Trust, we recognise our responsibility to ensure that our children and staff understand the current climate crisis and how our actions leave environmental footprints. With this knowledge, we continually seek to reduce our environmental impact by developing sustainable approaches to our daily operations and enabling our children and staff to see themselves as agents of change.

Through our Trust Eco Council, alongside the integrated work of the Trust Operations team, we work together towards our sustainability goals. Our climate action plan is one that we discuss, devise and work on together. Our five agreed strategic drivers (Use less, Build Knowledge, Buy Smart, Be agents of change and Recognise Success) enable us to deliver our stated actions. Inspired by the United Nations approach to climate action for children, we use the eight superheroes to provide a framework to guide our thoughts. Individual school goals are added as appropriate.
