## Climate action plan

As a Trust, we recognise our responsibility to ensure that our children and staff understand the current climate crisis and how our actions leave environmental footprints. Through our Trust Eco Council, alongside the integrated work of the Trust Operations team, we work together towards our sustainability goals.
