Wonder Zone - Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.


Smart Zone – A Mummy Ate My Homework



'Being whisked back to 1300 BC certainly wasn't on Henry's to-do list. Can he make his way through a new school, odd sports, unexpected friends and deadly pets, Egyptian style? And will he ever find his way back to the present day?'

Based on the Ancient Egyptians and this term's history topic, Smart Zone will be reading A Mummy Ate My Homework by Thiago De Moraes in their reading sessions and also as their reading for pleasure book. This riotously funny story has amusing illustrations throughout and hieroglyphics for the children to crack codes. Thiago De Moraes has also written other books such as the Myth Atlas and History Atlas.

Study Zone – The Boy at the Back of the Class.



'Told with heart and humour, The Boy at the Back of the Class is a child's perspective on the refugee crisis, highlighting the importance of friendship and kindness in a world that doesn't always make sense.'

Based on the current refugee crisis and the importance of acceptance and friendship, this book will also support Study Zone's History topic of The Ancient Islamic Civilisation and will be read during reading sessions and as their reading for pleasure book. This was the first book to be written by Onjali Q Rauf and was the winner of the Waterstone Book Prize in 2019. She has gone on to write The Star Outside my Window, The Night Bus Hero and The


Great Food Bank Heist.




